The Course

The BA Floristry Design Top Up is designed for students who have successfully completed the Foundation Degree in Floristry or an appropriate level 5 qualification in floristry and wish to top up to gain an honours degree award. The programme provides you with a balanced approach to design theory, research, practical application, analysis and evaluation in floristry, to further enhance your employability and career development within the floristry industry. The programme will introduce relevant live projects, commercial and client-focused activity culminating in the production of a comprehensive portfolio of work. Modules at Level 6 will encourage you to explore and experiment with the development of sustainable design techniques and materials, proposing new and exciting ways to approach floristry design. It is intended that this approach will allow you to follow your own creative direction whilst under the supervision of dedicated specialist tutors.

 > Managing critical evaluation to inform the delivery of an agreed outcome
 > Utilising relevant communication technologies proficiently
 > Employing selected design methodologies to generate ideas and design solutions

 > Communicating an informed critical insight into the context and design thought process for a variety of purposes and audiences
 > Producing industry relevant detail and visual communication drawings to respond to feedback and meet deadlines.
 > Evaluating the implications of design decisions
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- > Demonstrating skills applicable to a broad range of areas of employment

What You Will Study

- > Creative Research Essay 40 credits
- > Creative Design Project 40 credits
- > Portfolio 40 credits

Entry Requirements

You should have a relevant Level 5 qualification

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- A suitable reference
- A portfolio of creative work

Life and/or experience of non-traditional students will be taken into account when considering applications. The successful completion of an entry task may be required when considering applications without the required formal entry qualifications.

If your first language is not English, or a Tier 4 student visa to study is required and GCSE grade C/4 English or equivalent is not held, English language proficiency level such as International English Language Testing System (IELTS) 6.0 overall (with a minimum 5.5 in each skill) will need evidencing.

Teaching and Learning Approach

This programme is delivered with a variety of learning and teaching approaches to include all students' learning styles and preferences. For all modules, theory lectures will deliver the core content and provide you with underpinning knowledge. To complement the theory lectures, you will have practical demonstration sessions that are used to reinforce concepts delivered theoretically. Study at this level demonstrates increasing sophistication of design thinking and critical analysis within the design process. There is an expectation for considerable selfdirection and independence. Teaching will take place at our Bishop Burton campus in East Yorkshire, UK.

Time Required on Campus

The full-time pathway includes approximately 12 hours a week, incorporating lectures, seminars, debates and tutorials. You are also expected to carry out a significant amount of private study in addition to contact time (25-30 hours a week). A part-time option is also available. You can expect to receive your timetable during induction week.

Work Experience

Relevant extra-curricular activity and/or work experience is encouraged to enhance your learning.

How You're Assessed

The assessment methods used for each module will involve a variety of approaches demonstrating knowledge and skills across a range of contexts, reflecting an innovative and creative approach to assessment to cater for students individual learning styles. Assessment includes a research proposal and essay, research and development, a design project, a creative portfolio and a personal career profile. There are no formal examinations. Opportunities for feedback on assessments are available prior to the final submission to support your development and achievement. Staff aim to return assessed work within a 20-working day timeframe (not including holidays) so that you can most benefit from the feedback.
