The Course

Are you looking to develop a career in livestock production? This Agriculture T Level course will give you the knowledge and skills you need. You'll enjoy the ultimate blend of theoretical study in the classroom, gaining hands-on experience on our commercial farm and out in industry. T Levels have been developed in collaboration with employers to meet industry needs. They are a Level 3 qualification equivalent to 3 A Levels and offer you a balance of classroom theory, practical learning and a hands-on industry placement. You will spend 55% of your time in the classroom and the other 45% undertaking practical activities, including time spent in the workplace. This varies depending on the time of year. T Levels also carry UCAS points to take you on to university.

You will need to undertake a minimum of 315 hours (approximately 45 days) of on-the-job experience through an industry placement.
