Bishop Burton College and Riseholme College are committed to providing all students with comprehensive advice and guidance regarding progression routes beyond further and higher education.

Opportunities for access

The college runs a number of events and activities throughout the year, where external providers and employers can come onsite and speak to students. An example includes the Riseholme Employer Engagement Event to which employers and training providers attend and the HE Enterprise Event; a conference style event that provides key support for those looking to set up their own business or apply entrepreneurial skills.

Each department hosts a progression event, giving students the opportunity to assess their post college options.

Careers and progression related activities are held during National Careers Week in March and during National Apprenticeship week in February.

Employers, training providers and universities are regularly invited to be part of guest lectures, alongside other activities throughout the year

Workshops are bookable throughout the year, offering advice and guidance around different aspects of careers; often delivered by external speakers (FE/ HE providers and employers too).
